## Northern Delaware Greenway (NDG) Trail Stewards A Park Watch Program of Delaware State Parks

Training: Monday, July 20th, 5-8:00 p.m. Blue Ball Barn

**New Castle County**- More than 30 volunteers have answered the call to become a Northern Delaware Greenway Trail Steward, a collaborative effort between Delaware Greenways and the Park Watch Program of Delaware State Parks. The special focus of these volunteers will be stewardship of the Northern Delaware Greenway Trail, a ten-mile ribbon of green that extends from the Delaware to Brandywine River. Appropriate for bicycle and walking, the trail supports an active lifestyle within minutes of most New Castle County residents' door.

The Northern Delaware Greenway Stewards will receive three hours of training on Monday evening, July 20<sup>th</sup>, from 5-8:00 p.m. at Blue Ball Barn to prepare them for their experiences on the trail. An August 1<sup>st</sup> launch is anticipated for the group.
